NURSING PRACTICE IN COMMUNITY BASED CARE (CBC)

The Leading Age Oregon Nursing Practice in CBC course provides the most updated information related to regulatory compliance and standards of practice for nursing and health services in CBC. The aim is to assist learners in understanding the "systems perspective" related to operations and practice. The subjects during the first two days include the nurse role in CBC, change of condition and monitoring, evaluation and service planning, RN delegation, medication systems, understanding supportive devices, and abuse and neglect investigation and reporting. On the third day, the focus is on training and supervision, infection control, quality improvement, the survey process, and nurse well-being. Daily assignments allow the learner to do a deeper dive into the material. Learner dialogue during the course promotes a shared experience and community. **Earn 21 CEUs upon completion.**
