## APD Issues Implementation Plan for Reopening Salon Services in LTC Settings

Providers have been awaiting guidance from Adult and People with Disabilities (APD) on the reopening of salon services to residents living in nursing, assisted living and residential care facilities. Salon services have been recognized as an important service to a resident's well-being. Today, APD issued guidance on reopening salon services in Oregon LTC setting that addresses client/resident screening, detailed operations protocols, PPE and cleaning/disinfection. Guidance for residents leaving and reentering the community/facility is expected to be released later this week, as early as tomorrow. #### Funding to Nursing Facilities for the Purchase of Information Technology

Adult and People with Disabilities sent an information memo out to all nursing facilities to ensure they are aware that they can apply for up to a \$3,000 grant to purchase communication technology equipment. The purpose of the funding is to facilitate virtual visitation and telehealth visits for Oregon nursing home residents. The funding is available through the Civil Money Penalty Funds Program. To apply, facilities need to use the <u>COVID-19 Application Template</u> and include a cover letter that addresses the additional CMS requirements. Access the memo:
